

ADVANCED EVIDENCE PHOTOGRAPHY FOR THE INCIDENT SCENE

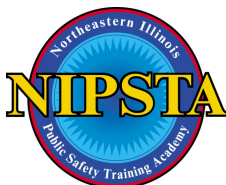
